The regular meeting of the Gearhart City Council was called to order on Wednesday October 3, 2018 at 7:00 p.m. by Council President Daniel Jesse. Present were Councilor Fackerell, Councilor Jesse, Councilor Cockrum, City Attorney Peter Watts and City Administrator Chad Sweet.

Council consented to add a second visitor's section to the agenda.

There was no conflict of interest declared by any member of Council.

ON MOTION by Councilor Fackerell, 2<sup>nd</sup> by Councilor Cockrum to approve the minutes for the Sept. 5, 2018 meeting, MOTION was approved 3-0, 2 absent.

- We are working with the City of Warrenton on a pre-application for Oregon Solutions. They offer technical expertise to find a solution regarding the elk herd.


Chief Deputy Paul Williams spoke to the council about supporting the bond measure and explained the existing jail and the need for a new one.

Carol Lucas 702 3<sup>rd</sup> St. has property that borders the East side of the Neacoxie Creek. It has huge spruce trees and wildlife. Ms. Lucas asked the City Council to consider purchasing her parklike property to add to Gearhart's Parks Master Plan.

Margaret Marino P.O. Box 2353 asked the city to consider applying for grants.  
There are funds available to help with costs of mowing and removal of invasive species.
