The Clatsop WORKS program was developed to provide local youth, ages 16 and up, with exposure to professional paid internship opportunities in Clatsop County, with the goals of community building, economic development, promoting local opportunities and retaining local talent.

Program Update:

- 17 interns have been placed at host employers throughout Clatsop County.
- Weekly professional development workshops have started and will continue through mid-August, hosted by our Clatsop Works employers. The first session, hosted by Englund Marine, was a huge success.
- Partnerships continue to build throughout Clatsop County with the goal of developing a stronger workforce, training and retaining local talent.
