

#### REASONS WE MAY DENY OR RESTRICT A LICENSE ORS 471.313(4)(5), OAR 845-005-0320, 845-005-0321, 845-005-0322 845-005-0325, 845-005-0326(4)(5) or 845-005-0355

The following is a list of problems relating to the **APPLICANT** or **BUSINESS** that OLCC <u>can</u> consider to refuse or restrict a license:

- 1. Applicant has a habit of using alcohol or drugs to excess
- 2. Applicant makes a false statement to OLCC (must be related to a refusal basis)
- 3. Applicant has been convicted of local, state or federal laws that are substantially related to the fitness of holding a liquor license
- 4. Applicant has demonstrated poor moral character
- 5. Applicant has a poor record of compliance when previously licensed by OLCC
- 6. Applicant is not the legitimate owner of the business
- 7. The business has a history of serious and persistent problems at this location. The problems can include:

obtrusive or excessive noise, music or sound vibrations public drunkenness fights or altercations harassment unlawful drug sales alcohol or related litter

OLCC is **not** able to consider the following issues when deciding to renew a liquor license:

lack of parking increase in traffic too many licenses in a specific area (saturation) entertainment type - nude dancing, gambling, live bands, etc. increased noise zoning issues

Visit www.oregon.gov/olcc/ to see the full text of ORS and OAR referenced above. In order an unfavorable recommendation from a local government to be valid, the grounds mus be found in the license refusal bases of ORS 471.313(4), 471.313(5), OAR 845-005-0320 845-005-0321, 845-005-0322, 845-005-0325 or 845-005-0326(4)(5) or the license restriction bases of OAR 845-005-0355, and must be supported by reliable factual information.

#### RENEWAL NOTIFICATION PROCESS

It's time again for liquor license renewals in your area. Liquor licenses are due to expire 3/31/2021. Attached is the list of licensees who are required to submit their renewal application to local governmen for comment. According to our records you charge:

#### HOW TO MAKE A RECOMMENDATION

You have until 3/4/2021 to make your recommendation. Below are your options for renewals:

#### RECOMMEND APPROVAL

**1. DO NOTHING.** If you do not submit a recommendation by **3/4/2021**, the OLCC will process the renewal application as a favorable recommendation.

#### **RECOMMEND DENIAL (see additional information on page 2)**

- 1. File an unfavorable recommendation, stating the grounds for the unfavorable (must meet the denial criteria on back of form); **OR**
- 2. Make a written request for additional time to complete an investigation. The request must state: 1) y are considering making an unfavorable recommendation; 2) the specific grounds being considered. The grounds must be one referenced in Oregon Administrative Rule 845-005-0308(3). If your request is granted you will be given a 45-day extension to file your unfavorable recommendation. Unfavorable means recommending denial of a license or requesting restrictions be placed on a license.

## Blue Sky<sup>™</sup> Block 2021 Prospective Product Content Label<sup>1</sup>

Blue Sky Block is sold in blocks of 200 kilowatt-hours (kWh). Blue Sky Block is a Renewable Energy Certificate (REC) product and does not contain electricity, which is billed separately. A REC represents the environmental benefits of 1 megawatt hour (MWh) of renewable energy.

In 2021, Blue Sky Block will be made up of the following new renewable resources averaged annually.

- I. These figures reflect the renewables that we plan to provide. Actual figures may vary according to resource availability. We will annually report to you before August I of next year in the form of a Historic Product Content Label the actual resource mix of the RECs you purchased.
- 2. New Renewables come from generation facilities that first began commercial operation within the past 15 years.
- 3. The Western region is defined as the states listed above, plus NV, AZ, MT, CO, NM, and the Canadian provinces of BC and AB.

In 2019, the "basic fuel mix", the average mix of energy sources supplying Pacific Power customers, is 56.44% coal, 18.37% natural gas, 7.98% wind, 4.45% hydro, 4.45% solar, 0.22% geothermal, 0.34% biomass, and 7.74% miscellaneous. This information is based on Federal Energy Regulatory Commission Form 1 data. The Pacific Power "basic fuel mix" is based on energy production and not resource capability, capacity or delivered energy.


All or some of the renewable energy attributes associated with wind, biomass, geothermal and qualifying hydro facilities in Pacific Power's fuel mix may be: (a) used to comply with renewable portfolio standards or other regulatory requirements, (b) sold to third parties in the form of renewable energy credits and/or other environmental commodities or (c) not acquired. Pacific Power's basic fuel mix includes owned resources and purchases from third parties. As of March 13, 2020, not counting compliance use, approximately 54 percent of the renewable energy attributes associated with 2019 generation and purchases was sold to third parties or not acquired. This percentage may increase upon subsequent company sale of renewable energy certificates representing 2019 generation.


The average Pacific Power residential customer uses approximately 955 kWh per month.
