Subject - New Business - Liquor License Application Review - Senders Wedding

Synopsis: Lisa Senders provided the City with the attached Special Event Liquor License application on August 23rd, 2024. Aware public space cannot be reserved in Gearhart, she's requesting approval for the service / consumption of alcohol at her daughter's wedding in Lesley Miller Dunes Meadow Park in July. A reminder to Council that while alcohol consumption is prohibited in Gearhart public spaces, our ordinance (#936) grants exception with a special event application and Council approval. The City Administrator makes a recommendation to Council with reasoning. Council must make the final decision to approve. Since no alcohol is being sold and the event is a wedding, the OLCC does not require an OLCC special event permit.

Council Options:

- 1) Motion to approve Ms. Senders' special event liquor license application;
- 2) Motion to approve with restrictions / changes;
- 3) Deny the application citing reasons:
- 4) Take other action desired by Council.

Recommendation: The City Administrator recommends City Council approve Ms. Senders' special event liquor license application with a simple motion.

Legal Analysis: The City implemented Ordinance #936 for process and Resolution #975 for fees. Section 8. A. states: *No person shall consume any alcoholic beverages in or upon any street, alley, or other public place, unless such place has been licensed for that purpose by the Commission; alcohol consumption is not permitted in public park spaces owned and operated by the City of Gearhart, Oregon. Any exception would be a specially licensed event approved by the Council.* A reminder the Commission (OLCC) does not require a permit in this case. Also per ordinance, an applicant submits their special event application for review. The City Administrator has 45-days from the date received to provide Council with a recommendation in a public forum. A public hearing prior to recommendation is available by request from the applicant and /or any party affected by the application. The City received no requests for a public hearing.

Financial Analysis: The City's special event liquor license application fee is \$25 and due at the time of submission.

Conditions of Use

If this application is approved, the applicant shall:

- 1. Agree to use a licensed server(s) and comply with any applicable OLCC regulations;
- 2. Not use glass beverage containers for personal consumption (not to be construed to prohibit bottles of wine);
- 3. Not serve, sell, consume, possess, or use distilled liquor unless an OLCC special events permit/temporary sales license has been obtained; only wire will be served.
- 4. Arrange for and pay for removal of trash generated by the event;
- 5. Obtain event insurance and provide evidence 5 business days in advance of the event of coverage in the amount of \$5,000,000 per claim, naming the City as an additional insured;
- 6. Pay the permit fee at the time of submission, unless a longer time is approved by the City Council and authorized by the City Administrator;
- 7. Sign a liability waiver, indemnity, defense, and hold harmless agreement on a form prescribed by the City Administrator (attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference);
- 8. Obtain a Noise Permit from the City if event sound levels are anticipated to reach over 50 dBA between 10:00 p.m. 8:00 a.m. or over 60 dBA between 8:00 a.m. 10:00 p.m.
- 9. Provide alternative non-alcoholic beverages;
- 10. Cease all alcohol service by the time requested on this application unless otherwise noted as a condition below;
- 11. Provide food items; and
- 12. Comply with any other conditions the City deems prudent.

GEARHART LIQUOR LICENSE SPECIAL EVENT APPLICATION (Addendum)

Event Information and Mandatory Criteria

2) Identify the proposed confined alcohol serving and consumption area methods of boundary control:

Alcohol provided at the wedding reception will be confined to the Dunes Meadow Park only. If a smaller area is preferred by the city, alcohol could be restricted to a canopy covered area. Creative Celebrations, a wedding event firm (see attached for information about Creative Celebrations), will have 2 employees on site for the duration of the event for 6-8 hours as needed and alcohol usage will be monitored. (See #3 below). If intoxication is observed, the Senders family will be notified immediately and arrange for safe and appropriate transportation of any guest. It will be announced at the wedding prior to the reception that all drinking is to be restricted to the park confines.

If a guest is observed leaving the confines of the park with alcohol, they will be asked to leave their drink behind.

#3) Define event security to be provided to avoid consumption outside defined boundaries, consumption by intoxicated guests, and consumption by minors.

Identification will be required by all who are served alcohol or those drinking alcohol. Bracelets must be worn by all attending the wedding reception that will be color coded to indicate age 21 or over. Also, see #2 above regarding monitoring and confining consumption to the park only.

BATHROOM FACILITIES

Two homes across from the park on 1st Avenue occupied by the wedding couple's family have a total of 6.5 bathrooms and can be used by the guests as needed. In the alternative, "wedding port-a-potties" could be placed on site.
